The Village of North Lewisburg Council met on March 10, 2026, at 6:30PM in the Village Community Room.

Mr. Bagshaw replied stating The IRS is still processing 2023/2024 submitted payments. We are supposed to receive and update in April. A portion of the response does not match our records.

Administrator Freyhof updated the group on the Cyber Security requirements and quotes. Mr. Freyhof is currently researching surveillance contracts, such as, Crowd Strike, Artic Wolf and Sentinel One. Council has been provided a Cyber Security Resolution approve by Solicitor Anthony Will and a document highlighting recent Village Cyber Security Improvements. Administrator Freyhof will continue to look at options.

### **STAFF REPORTS:**

#### **Police:**

Chief Bodey reported Officer Huff has completed Crisis Intervention Training. Chief is also working on a policy for charging for public records request for body camera footage. The 2021 Ford Pursuit Vehicle has 50,000 miles on it, we may need to look at purchasing a new vehicle in 2028. Our 2023 Durango has 15,000 miles on it and will be good for several more years. The department had 15 traffic stops, 2 citations and 1 felony OVI arrest.

#### **Water & Sewer:**

We have submitted for Congressional Funding for our water line replacement project. Administrator Freyhof will provide a response once received.

We are planning a RCAP water rate presentation for Saturday April 25, 2026 at 10:00 am in the Community Room. Samples of the water line from a recent break are on display in the community room.

Administrator Freyhof is discussing our current Scada scenario with other water operators for their opinion. They are going to provide a future opinion on which direction to go.

**Streets:**

Administrator Freyhof discussed the fireworks for the Bicentennial will be \$8700.00. They require 50% down (\$4350.00). He asked Council if the Village could donate the 50% to the Bicentennial Committee. Mrs. Huffman moved to approve a donation for the 50% of \$8700.00 down payment for fireworks to the Bicentennial Committee, Mrs. Wirtz seconded.
